

Both Jerry and Marianne Corey received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Mental Health Counselors Association in 2011, and both also received the Eminent Career Award from ASGW in 2001. I find (am reading now) Becoming a Helper a densely packed, user-friendly textbook that provides lots of case examples to illustrate points. It will surely become a well-used reference as I progress in my counselor training. This is my first Corey and Corey book, but will certainly not be the last. For the neophyte counselor, or helper as they term it, this is a necessary opener.
