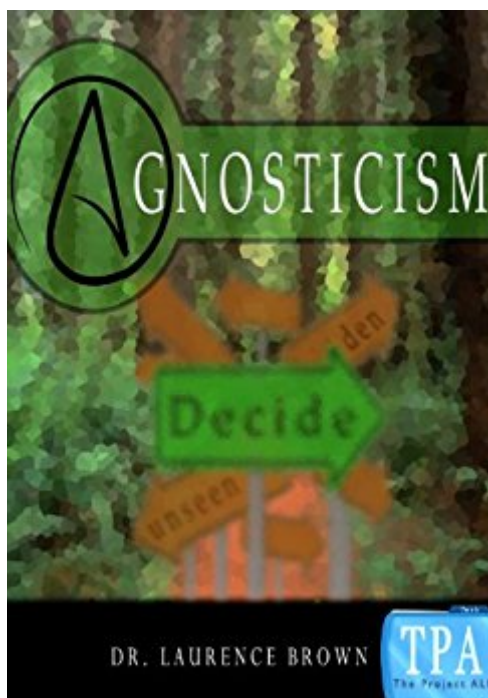

This is a well-written piece about Agnosticism in the greater religious context. Huxley, Kant and the skeptics are mentioned: why is the term "Agnosticism" indicated as a somewhat complacent term when it has grown so much in popularity? It is food for thought. Agnosticism is a rational choice based on reason. Many religious viewpoints have agendas whereas Agnosticism is a more placid standpoint, some people think. One part of the discussion hits the nail on the head: many Gnostics believe only a few are "saved" (i.e. those who believe in the religion of choice) but in perspective, is that truly "Godlike"? The critique touches on a variety of beliefs, including Judaism, Agnostic Theism and Islam. Many translations of the religious texts (in the example cited, translations of the Quran)

have agendas, where people have no idea of this fact when reading it. It is an interesting and thought-provoking read. It is recommended as a short readable history and perspective of Agnosticism.

It stimulates and challenges you to use your thinking . If you want to put all your past prejudices aside and try to reach truth , then read this book and all his other books ... Even the fiction books are really good :)
