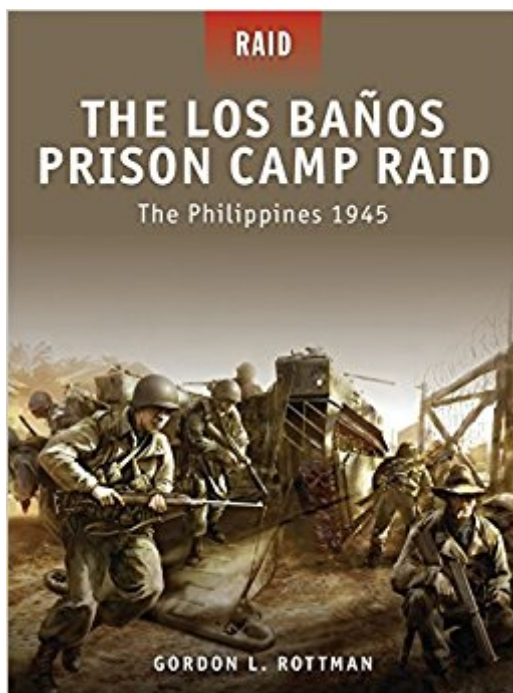

The Los Banos Prison Camp Raid: The Philippines 1945



Synopsis

Learn the story of one of World War II's most masterfully executed raids. On the southwest shore of Laguna de Bay, near a village of the same name, stood the Los Banos Internment Camp. Held within were over 2,000 starving men, women, and children, guarded by 250 Japanese soldiers, and surrounded by several thousand more in the nearby countryside. As the desperate battle for Manila raged, it was feared that the prisoners would be executed or moved beyond the reach of the liberating armies. Only 130 Paratroopers could be spared for the rescue operation and this stunning triumph of courage and perfect timing in the face of overwhelming odds is rendered with riveting detail in this new Raid title. Author Gordon Rottman offers a bird's-eye-view from the origins of the conflict through the planning and execution of the raid and this in-depth analysis is backed by rare photographs and stunning artwork by Johnny Shumate. Gordon L. Rottman entered the US Army in 1967, volunteered for Special Forces and completed training as a weapons specialist. He served in the 5th Special Forces Group in Vietnam in 1969-70 and subsequently in airborne infantry, long-range patrol and intelligence assignments until retiring after 26 years. He was a Special Operations Forces scenario writer at the Joint Readiness Training Center for 12 years and is now a freelance writer, living in Texas. The author lives in Cypress, Texas.

I was 7 at the time of the raid and had my 8th birthday at New Bilibid before we were brought back to the U.S. on the USS Eberle from Manila to Long Beach, CA. Eternal thanks to the 11th Airborne; 511th PIR, the Amtrac Crews, the C-47 Crews, the Recon platoon, the Guerillas, Command Officers and many others who participated in that precise, magnificent and storied operation. Longer and more detailed books about the Los Banos rescue are available, but this publication is a very good, easy reading and factual summary account of events surrounding the 2-23-45 operation in the Philippines. Yet another book about a rescue from a Japanese internment camp in World War II Philippines, and the best summary so far of the rescue at the Los Baños camp because of the many illustrations. The 80-page book is also commendable for the fairly decent credit given to Filipino guerilla fighters, and for at least the brief coverage of the horrible reprisals suffered by Filipino civilians in the area after the rescue. The author is expert about the U.S. military, and readers seeking information about operational details, equipment, and the officers involved will not be disappointed. My main criticism is the presence of various little geographic errors and confusion due to the author's unfamiliarity with the area.

I was not aware of this particular prison raid of 2100 civilians by the U.S. Army. Here is another heroic story about the brave men of our armed services, who parachuted into this camp to rescue these men and women. This book centers on this rescue as just one event of the war in the Pacific. Until I read this book, I was unaware of this story. Photographs are excellent giving the reader an

excellent perspective.
