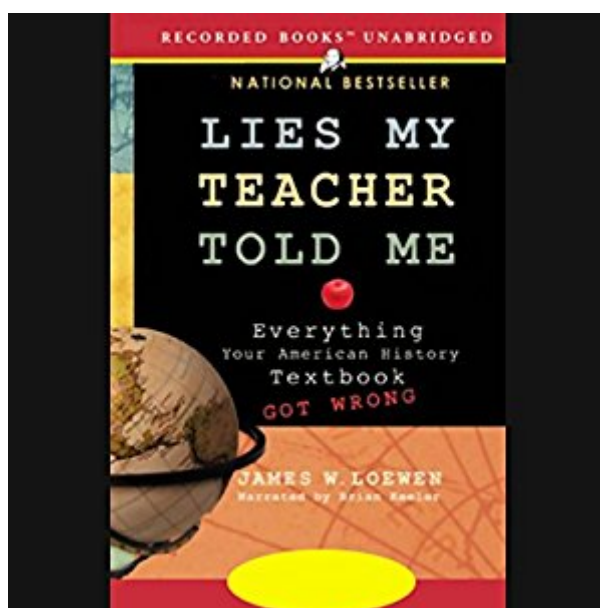

In *Lies My Teacher Told Me*, James W. Loewen brings history alive in all its complexity and ambiguity. Beginning with pre-Columbian history and ranging over characters and events as diverse as Reconstruction, Helen Keller, the first Thanksgiving, and the My Lai massacre, Loewen offers an eye-opening critique of existing textbooks, and a wonderful retelling of American history as it should and could be taught to American students. If you believe that history should be more than a congratulatory chorus for the United States, then this is the book for you. It explains why so many high school graduates are ignorant about history, and how the truth is skimmed over and overlooked in favor of a bland cocktail of equal parts banality and obfuscation and tedious repetition of "factoids." The interconnectedness that makes history so fascinating is completely missing from any study of history before college level. Certainly, if a subject is interesting enough to spawn thousands of books, hundreds of hours of television and even two television networks, then text book publishers could make it a little bit easier for high school students to stomach.

This gives a much-needed and well-researched perspective to the depth needed to address our country's history. It incorporates first person accounts from multiple perspectives to give a well-rounded idea of the events that have happened. He breaks down a brick wall of concepts I never thought to question when I was in high school. Every page makes me want to run to the library and do more research! Wonderfully written!

I have read thousands of books. I have long since known that the whitewashed history we are taught in school, and validated through the media, is not true history.
