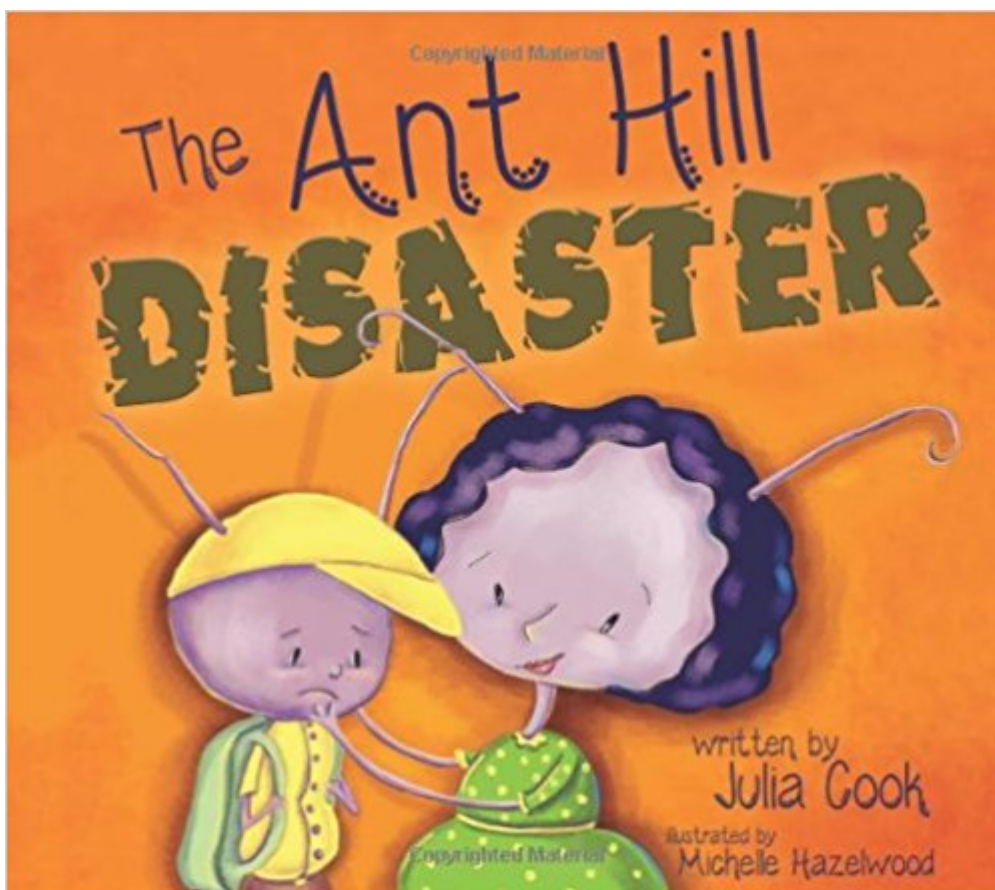

In this story, a human steps on and destroys a colony of ants. The similarity to school shootings is obvious but this can be used for other types of trauma as well. Due to the storyline, it would make most sense to use this with a child who is not alone in being traumatized--a trauma at school, a trauma that impacts a family, etc. The story references traumatized people grieving and recovering together. Engaging and realistic. Tips for adults included. Recommended, grades PreK-2.
