


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# Reflections: An Oral History Of Twin Peaks

I found this intermittently interesting. A lot of it is actors and directors talking about themselves and each other, to the poinet where it became repetetive. I was more interested in the show, itself.

I was completely taken with Twin Peaks when it aired, and it has remained a favorite of mine over the years. This book took me behind the scenes and provided a lot of insight into what it took to get the show on the air and what happened in the second half of the second season, when things took a bit of a wrong turn. Still, there's little better than the first 15 or 16 episodes, and this book allowed me to return to them and their mystical setting.

Fun to read. There weren't many major revelations, and there's endless backslapping, but it's a good insight into the phenomenon and a reminder of how much of a culture shock it was, and how it changed TV. It's a shame some of the big names chose not to be interviewed, but it's never surprising when that happens.
