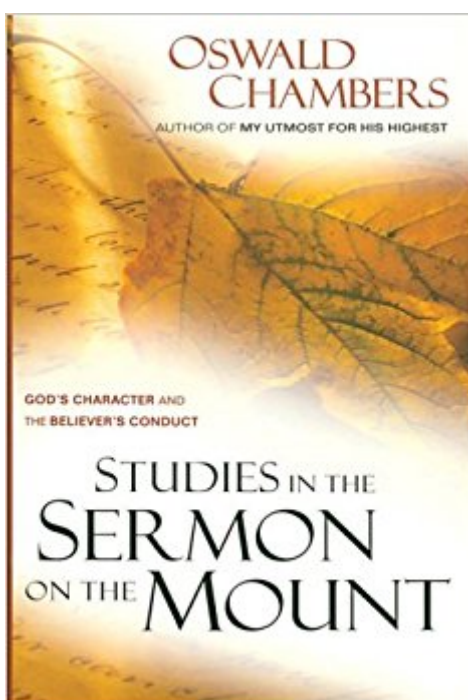

This devotional study of the Sermon on the Mount is doctrine in work clothes, truth become reality, redemption expressed. And, as he does in all his works, Oswald Chambers reminds us that our focus must be on God alone and not on those among whom we live. This series on Matthew 5-7 was first presented during Chambers' teaching ministry in the U.S. in 1907. Since then, it has become a favorite among all his writings for its timeless truths and relevance to the daily Christian life. Once you delve into it, you'll better understand Jesus' teachings on what living really means and find new ways to apply Scripture to your daily life. As Chambers says, - God remakes us, puts His Holy Spirit in us, then the Holy Spirit applies the principles to us and enables us to work out by His guidance.-

Oswald Chambers (1874-1917) was born July 24, 1874, in Aberdeen, Scotland. He came into a personal relationship with Jesus as his Savior in his teen years under the ministry of Charles Haddon Spurgeon, and studied art and archeology at the University of Edinburgh before answering a call from God to the Christian ministry. He then studied theology at Dunoon College. From 1906-1910 he conducted an itinerant Bible-teaching ministry in the United States, the United Kingdom, and Japan. In 1910, Chambers married Gertrude Hobbs. They had one daughter, Kathleen. In 1911 he founded and became principal of the Bible Training College in Clapham, London, where he lectured until the school was closed in 1915 because of World War I. In October 1915 he sailed for Zeitoun, Egypt (near Cairo), where he ministered to troops from Australia and New Zealand as a YMCA chaplain. He died there November 15, 1917, following surgery for a ruptured appendix. Although Oswald Chambers wrote only one book, *Baffled to Fight Better* (since updated and titled *Our Ultimate Refuge*), more than thirty titles bear his name. Mrs. Chambers, a court stenographer, compiled the rest of her husband's published works from her verbatim shorthand notes. For half a century following her husband's death she labored to give his words to the world. *My Utmost For His Highest*, his best-known work, has been continuously in print in the United States since 1935 and remains in the top ten titles of the religious book bestseller list with millions of copies in print. It has become a Christian classic. I'm about half-way through the book and it's interesting and good for my spiritual growth. But here's the rub about this particular version that I wish id known: the print is old time print that is I assume meant to recreate the original version, but is hard on the eyes. It's a little bigger in size, thank god because otherwise it would be impossible to read because it's not solid print (the letters look somewhat worn or something). My recommendation is buy this book if you are interested, just don't buy this version bc it's hard to read - Oswald Chambers has such interesting insight into the sermon on the mount that I've never heard before, which really helps spiritual growth. I wish it just had normal print that wasn't so hard on the eyes.

A classic by Oswald Chambers, this book will change your life and endear you to Jesus. If you are a lukewarm Christian, or not yet a Christian, this study on *The Sermon on the Mount* will draw you ever closer to Jesus, kindling a flame of desire to please Him and bring you into a deeper walk with Him.

Among all the doctrine, parables, and lessons of the Bible, none is as difficult to walk in as The Sermon on the Mount. Jesus' teachings, captured in Matthew 5, challenge and convict all thoughtful believers. Oswald Chambers offers radical insights into those difficult-to-live-out principles. For example: "The Sermon on the the Mount produces despair in the heart of the natural man, and that is the very thing Jesus means it to do." p.10 and, "[Jesus] did not come to teach us only: He came to make us what He teaches we should be." p.10 Even the most mature believer will be challenged by Chambers as he gets infinitely close to our tender spots: "Most of us are pagans in a crisis; we think and act like pagans." p.57 Oswald Chambers, best known for his no-nonsense, plain speaking about the most difficult truths in the Christian experience hits the mark time and time again in this special book. This is real meat for the hungry soul.

One point that is made in this book (well taken) is to remember who it is that is saying the Things that are being said.

Oswald Chambers is a great author and preacher. The 1 star negative was the copy for ebook was stilted and short script making it harder to read on a tablet. Many gramatical errors from copying.

It is a worthy venture to apply some months of study to the Sermon on the Mount and meditate upon it. We read various commentaries in preparation for an adult Sunday school series, and this was of great value. It is brief but dense in content, reaching deep to the soul.
