

Rabbi Nathan Laufer is Director of the Advanced Institute for Judaic Studies at the San Diego Jewish Academy and former Director of Israel Programs for the Tikvah Fund. Prior to that, he served as Founding Director of the Partnership for Effective Learning and Innovative Education (PELIE) and as President and CEO of the Wexner Heritage Foundation, where he is now President Emeritus. Rabbi Laufer received his rabbinic ordination from Yeshiva University, his leadership educator certification from Harvard University, and his Juris Doctor from Fordham University. He is the author of Leading the Passover Journey and The Genesis of Leadership. He lectures in Israel and North America on how to develop meaningful Jewish identities and values-based leadership in the twenty-first century.

Rendezvous With God is one of the most edifying, englightening, and inspirational books on the

Jewish Holidays that I have ever read. I could not recommend this book more highly.

Rabbi Nathan Laufer explains that the idea "at the heart of his book is that for the Jewish people, the Jewish holidays of Passover, Shavuot, Rosh HaShana, Yom Kippur, and Sukkot retell the founding stories of the relationship between God and the Jewish people in their honeymoon year together as a couple." He does this in nine chapters that include four chapters that speak about sacred time, the Shabbat, the hiddenness of God, and the Torah. He tells us that the Torah "records seven revelation of God's presence to the entire people within" Israel's first year as a nation, and he lists them and examines each of them. He shows with a chart how each revelation is related to a holiday. He describes the practices of the holidays, the Torah readings assigned to the days, the liturgies, and explains why the acts are done and why the readings are read. He explains, for example, the Passover Seder, the meal and readings. He tells us why Moses' name is left out of the readings. He lists fifteen steps to redemption that he sees in the Passover Seder readings. He explains, to site other examples, that Jews count the days between Passover and Shavuot because Passover recalls the exodus from Egypt but Shavuot commemorates the goal of the exodus, the important part of Judaism, the revelation of the Torah. He describes three elements that marked the Israelite bondage in Egypt: the rigor of their work that seared their souls, that the Israelites had nothing to show from their work, and there was no day of rest, no Shabbat, no holidays. He tells how the days of rest are important to freedom. In short, the rabbi gives his interpretation of the experiences the freed Israelites experienced during their first year of freedom, explains the value of freedom and how it should be observed, and he gives Jews today the possibility of experiencing the many instances of divine redemption which serve to inspire humans to similarly redeem other people who are still enslaved in many ways, endangered, impoverished, undereducated, despondent, and homeless.
