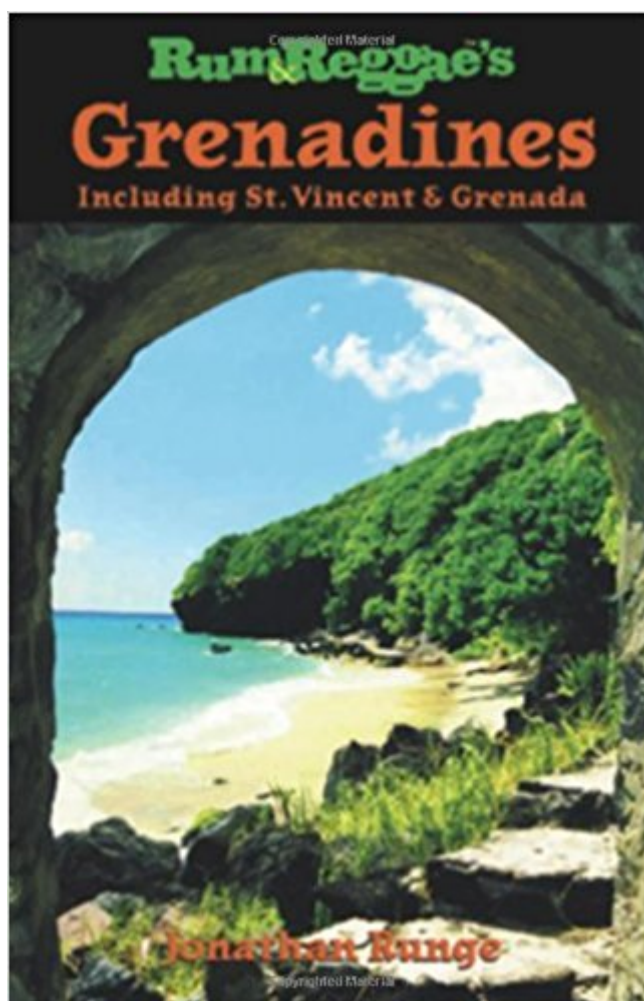


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Rum & Reggae's Grenadines: Including St. Vincent & Grenada (Rum & Reggae Series)

Covered are the relatively undiscovered destination of St. Vincent; the majestic Grenada (the Spice Isle), and the Grenadine islands—Bequia, Mustique, Mayreau, Canouan, the Tobago Cays, Union, Palm, Petit St. Vincent, Petit Martinique, and Carriacou.

We spent two months in Grenada, St Vincent, and the Grenadines on our sailboat in the winter of 2008. We had seven guide books for this area -- Rum & Reggae was our favorite. For exploring, hiking, snorkeling, eating: this book consistently recommended places and activities that were more interesting and less touristy. Sure, we used the others books too, but we used this one more. Note that we were living on our sailboat and did not use their hotel recommendations. We've since bought the Rum & Reggae books for the rest of the areas that we plan to explore next winter.

We bought this and 2 others for our trip to Grenada. We put them on our kindle and referred to all of them equally. We were only interested in the local history and areas of interest for day trips, as we already had booked lodging and are willing to eat anywhere.

First, the book very clearly explains (on Page 13 in the introduction) that Grenada is a separate country from St. Vincent and the Grenadines! Second, the rum punch recipe does not profess to be the exact St. Vincent & the Grenadines recipe. It is the Rum & Reggae recipe. It's just a fun little tidbit. Please consider being a bit more open minded and accurate before posting such negativity. This is a fun and informative guide -- perfect for setting the tone for a trip to the Grenadines.
