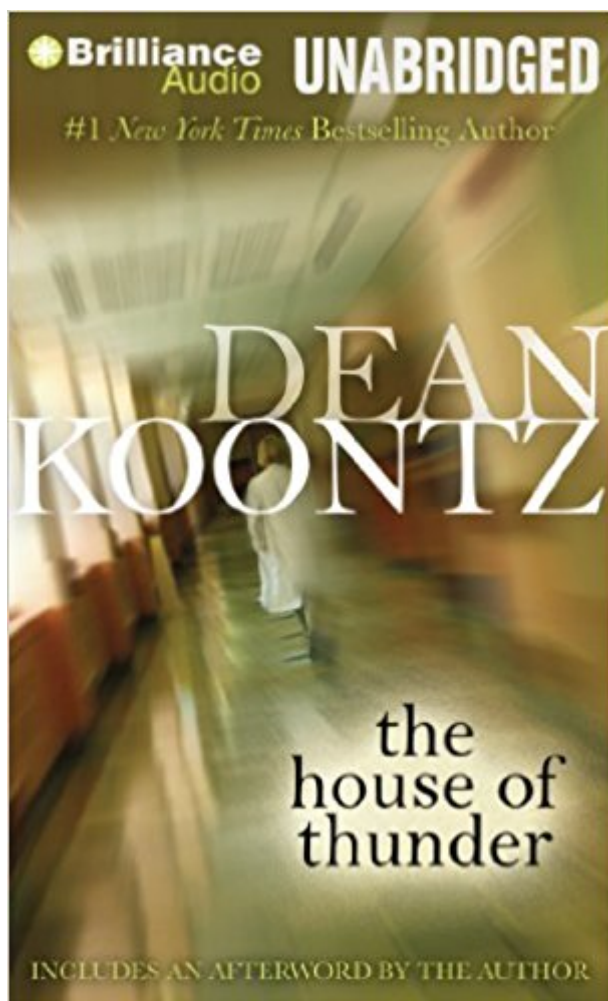

Koontz (*Watchers* , *The Servants of Twilight*) has come up with an intriguing premise: Susan Thornton wakes up in a hospital after a serious car accident with an odd, selective amnesia. She can remember nothing of her job, yet she is stricken with fear when the company she works for is named. And that's not all. Thirteen years earlier, Susan had witnessed the murder of her boyfriend during a brutal fraternity hazing; her testimony sent one of the four men responsible to prison. Now she sees the same men, looking not a day older, walking the corridors of the hospital. Even worse, she has recurrent macabre hallucinations involving them and the decomposing corpse of her boyfriend. Susan doubts her sanity until she stumbles upon a bit of hard evidence right out of one of the "hallucinations." Koontz's resolution, involving a complex Soviet plot, transforms the story from a cozy chiller to political thriller and may not please readers tired of cold war paranoia and propaganda. I read this book when I was about 8 years old and was traumatized by it. So of course I wanted to read it again and see if it was as creepy as I remembered! It kind of was... The ending REALLY didn't make sense to me as a child, and as an adult it's not much better. Though I at least understood the ending this time around, it just seemed like an afterthought. And a bad one at that. It seems like the author had an idea for a book about a woman haunted by her past but just didn't have a good reason or villain so he just slapped some completely absurd ending on the book and called it good. I enjoyed reading it just for the nostalgia, but I don't recommend it as a good book or anything. It's pretty awful.

This story started out well enough, being early Koontz, there was a lot of wasted dialogue - yah, yah, got it, move on - but there was a lot of suspense. Sadly the story ended abruptly with no

crescendo, no big finish, nada. It's like he just quit. Total let down.

This effort on Koontz's part is just not up to his usual level of entertainment. One of the reasons that he's so good is that you attach to the main characters and progress through the book like a tail hooked on a cat. You feel what the character feels and empathize as if you are the object of the story. This, however, enticed me only as an observer into the life of a character I really didn't care that much about. The book had the possibility of being one of Koontz's better novels but these prospects were never realized. We have a lady hospitalized after a car accident, a fraternity hazing, a sinister corporation, a hospital with secret doors, people who aren't who they say they are - wow - what a set up! Unfortunately, it just didn't come together. Love Dean - I'll patiently wait for his next installment of the Frankenstein series. bg
