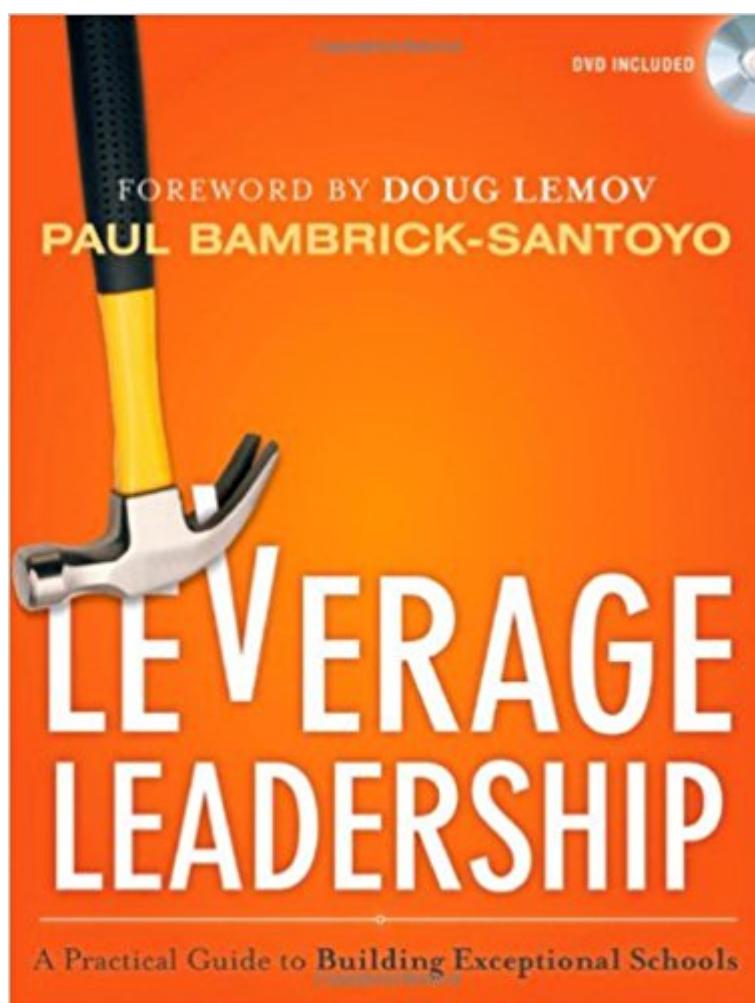

Edited below: Book is heavily dependent on additional media material, such as videos and pdf's, which you are supposed to download from Wiley. Apparently you can only download this material if you buy direct from Wiley, and is not available if you buy from them on . You must create an account with Wiley before you can download, and the only way to do that is to buy directly from them. I contacted both the author(Santoyo) and the publisher(Wiley) and they do not respond to emails or return calls, even after a week! I am so frustrated I almost returned it, but there is a little in there that I use for reference. Notice other reviews stated the same thing. I wish I listened to them. Edit: This is a great book, and once you get to the additional media it is super useful. Thank you so much to the author for help on getting the DVD material for the book. The way to access this is go to the part about how to access the DVD contents and find the link to the website and your "Reference ID." Go to the Wiley website via the link in the book. You do not need to create a new account. Your email for is your user name. The reference ID in the book is the password.

This book is a great read for any administrator or instructional coach. Specific details are explained how to transform your school with video clips to illustrate. There are self assessments so that you can reflect on where your school stands, and there are suggested timelines with action steps for change. This book is practical and a one-stop read to help make change. They even include possible PD that you can use with your faculty. I would highly recommend this book.
