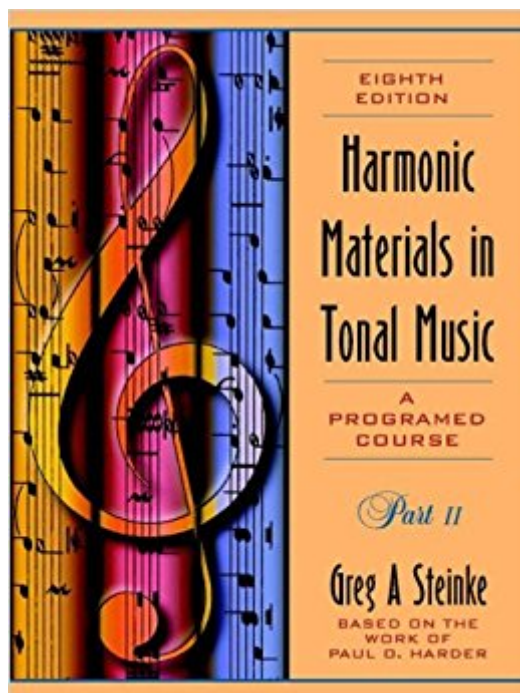


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Harmonic Materials In Tonal Music: A Programmed Course Part II

Unfortunately, the rating goes to a provider of a used book rather than to the course. I highly recommend the course. I got online, searching for this specific course as a review course for myself. When I originally used the course, I found it was excellent.
