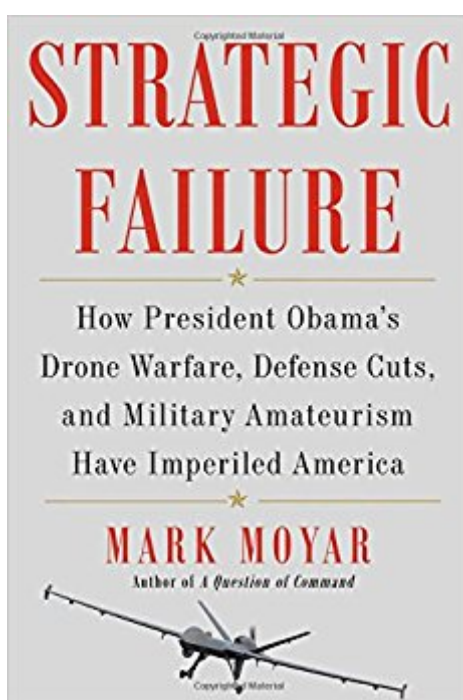

Strategic Failure: How President Obama's Drone Warfare, Defense Cuts, And Military Amateurism Have Imperiled America



Synopsis

A distinguished historian with over a decade inside the US Department of Defense shows how the downsizing of our armed forces lowers the nation's defense and puts us at risk. In this stunningly detailed account of US military power in the Obama era, Mark Moyar reveals how Obama's military decisions have led to the international catastrophes of his second term. While our current downward spiral did not grab the attention of the American people until 2014, Moyar finds its roots in Obama's first-term decisions to shrink the US military and replace large overseas military commitments with "light footprints." Obama's preoccupation with his political self-interest has consistently trumped the national interest. Moyar documents how Obama has failed to deliver on his substitutes for military power. Regardless of one's opinion of the Obama administration's management of US defense policy, this book is well worth the time to read; perhaps more so if one doesn't have an opinion on the matter. As the title implies, Mark Moyer is critical of Mr. Obama's policies, but as a well-regarded expert in the area of national security, his opinion is well worth considering. I think his analysis of the limitations of the use of drones in place of troops on the ground or manned aircraft offensive force is exceptionally good. His contention that Obama administration defense policy is too heavily driven by domestic political considerations and made too often by White House staffers with little or no

background in defense matters is consistent with what former advisors with presumably no axe to grind (e.g., Robert Gates and Leon Panetta, to name two) have written. Those who are favorably inclined towards Mr. Obama might find Moyar's opinions as to what motivates Obama's decisions somewhat biased, but that's up to the reader to discern. Overall, I found this book well researched and well written. It's not the easiest of reads, but it's also not the easiest of subjects. If I had to pick one area covered by the book that I would have liked to see discussed in greater depth, it would be the general inability of our "coalition partners" to provide a substantial contribution to any joint military efforts. In its relatively brief handling of this subject, Moyar explains that most of our assumed partners have neither the desire nor military capacity to participate in any joint effort beyond some minor symbolic effort. Given that much of the current administration's strategy relies on having others "step up" and assume more of the military burden where there is a common interest, whether this assumption is even plausible is a question well worth probing.

"Strategic Failure" is the latest book by well-known military historian Mark Moyar. The book's subtitle clearly identifies the author's premise and principal theme: "How President Obama's Drone Warfare, Defense Cuts, and Military Amateurism Have Imperiled America." It is axiomatic that most US presidents come into office with a well-established domestic agenda only to realize rather quickly that foreign affairs are where more momentous decision making is required. So it was/is with President Obama. "Strategic Failure" documents, country by country and event after event, what the author considers critical failures that have been "leading the country and the world toward disaster." Significantly many of Obama's actions have been taken purely for political reasons. The slick packaging of Candidate Obama by David Axelrod (Petraeus called Axelrod a complete spin doctor) led Americans to believe they had the real deal in Obama. And so they elected him not once but twice. Even today, his actions are calculated to make him look good. He is known to have said to Secretary Gates, "My poll numbers will be stronger if I take issue with the military over Afghanistan Policy." Strategic Failure is a bold and accurate portrayal of the gross failures of the Obama administration in international affairs. The US and the free world are bearing the cost of these failures. A clear example of this price is the problem of ISIS. If one had not lived through the Obama years and observed it all taking place, one might conclude that Moyar grossly overstates the case against our lead-from-behind president. However, when you've seen it, you have to believe. Anti-Obama readers will read this book and feel vindicated in their position; Pro-Obama

people should read it and get a good picture of the sort of the Un-leader they've been supporting.
